# Hackforth & Hornby C of E Primary School

## Admissions Policy

### **Introduction**

The governing body of Hackforth & Hornby CE Primary School applies the regulations on admissions fairly and equally to all those who wish to attend this school. The School Standards and Framework Act 1998 introduced a new framework for school admissions as of September 2000. This policy conforms to the regulations that are set out in that Act and also further explained in the statutory School Admissions Code of Practice and the statutory Appeals Code of Practice.

### **Aims and objectives**

We are an inclusive school that welcomes children from all backgrounds and abilities. All applications will be treated on merit and in a sensitive manner. The only restriction we place on entry is that of number. If the number of children applying for entry exceeds the places available, we enforce the procedure set out below in order to determine whether a child is accepted or not. It is our wish to allow parents the right to have a place at the school of their choice. However, this is not always possible, due to the excess demand on the school places available.

The level of ability of a child or any special needs that s/he may have plays no part in the admissions policy of this school.

### **How parents can apply for their child to be admitted to our school**

As our school is Church of England Primary School, the school determines the admission arrangements in agreement with the LEA. The LEA is therefore the 'Admissions Authority' for our school. The regulations for entry to each school, where the Admissions Authority is the LEA, are published each year by the LEA. Parents can receive a copy of these regulations directly from the LEA.

The LEA publishes a composite admissions prospectus each year, which gives information about how parents can apply for a place in the school of their choice. Parents have a right to express a preference for the school of their choice and they should do so on the application form. Expressing a preference does not, in itself, guarantee a place at this school. Application forms can be obtained from the Education Department of the LEA and should be completed by the date stipulated on the forms. In this area, children enter school in the academic year they become five.

There is one admission's date per year, early in September (i.e. at the start of the school year). Children commence school at the beginning of the academic year in which they have their fifth birthday. Children born between 1st September and 30th April may start full-time schooling in September.

Parents who would like their child to be admitted to this school during the year their child is five should complete the admission forms provided by the local Area Education Office, or via the link on our 'Useful Links' page on our website.

### **Admission appeals**

The LEA offers places to our school. If your child is not offered a place at this school, it is because to do so would prejudice the education of other children by allowing the numbers of children in the school to increase too much.

If parents wish to appeal against a decision regarding entry, they can do so by applying to the LEA. An independent appeals panel then meets to consider all appeals by parents who have been refused a place at our school and who wish to appeal against this decision. An appeals panel's decision is binding for all parties concerned. If the appeals panel decides that we should admit a child to our school, then we will accept this and continue to do all we can to provide the best education for all the children at our school. (Details of appeal arrangements are set out in the Code of Practice on School Admissions Appeals, which came into force in September 1999.)

### **The standard number**

The standard number is the number of children the school can accommodate in each year group. The standard number for our school is at present 7. We review this number annually. The current number for 2017/18 is 10, as agreed with admissions.

### **Infant class size**

We teach infant children (aged four to seven) in classes that usually have a maximum number of 25 children.

### **Review**

This policy will be reviewed annually with the Admissions Authority in the light of any changed circumstances in our school or the local area.
